



Mosquito Abatement Program



The first village-wide spray for mosquito abatement was administered on Wednesday, June 9, 2010. The next application will be posted here as soon as we are notified.

The Village's mosquito control contractor, Clarke Mosquito Control, provides a comprehensive mosquito abatement program designed to control nuisance mosquitoes, reduce the potential of mosquito-borne disease transmission and provide a comfortable and healthy summertime atmosphere for residents.

Clarke utilizes an integrated pest management approach, including larval control, biological control and the strategic use of EPA labeled and registered pesticides for adult mosquito population control. More specifically, Clarke monitors the presence of adult mosquitoes in traps at various locations throughout Lisle, and treats standing water and catch basins for mosquitoes. Occasionally, Village-wide truck sprays are required.

Residents may call Clarke's Mosquito Hotline at 1-800-942-2555 to sign-up for an automated notification that is provided in advance of a spraying.

The following strategies are intended to assist residents in protecting themselves from mosquitoes:

Wear repellent, long-sleeves, and long-pants after dusk.

Change water in birdbaths and plant pots at least once a week.

Keep grass cut and shrubbery well trimmed.

Keep drains, ditches and culverts clean of weeds and refuse so water will drain properly.

SEWER BACKUP PREVENTION



How could a sewer backup affect me?

An overflow in a wastewater line generally results from a stoppage in the line, which causes the wastewater to backup into nearby pipes and drains. Stoppages can occur not only in the main sewer lines outside your home, but also within your home or office plumbing system.

If the backup occurs in a Village maintained line, the wastewater will normally overflow out of the lowest possible opening, which is usually a manhole. However, in some homes, especially those with basements or where the lowest level is even with the sewer lines, the overflowing wastewater may exit through lower drains and toilets.

What causes sewage backups?

In home and office plumbing systems, the main cause is accumulation of grease, hair, and other solid materials. Also, many items which are too large for wastewater pipes to handle (such as disposable diapers and sanitary napkins) are often flushed down toilets. All of these items can cause major backups in the Town's lines as well.

The greatest cause of wastewater stoppages within the Village's systems; however, is vandalism. Leaves, sticks, rocks, bricks, and trash have been found stuffed down manholes.

What can I do to help?

Call the Public Works Department immediately if you notice any cases of vandalism to sewer lines or manholes. This way, the debris can be removed before it causes a backup.

Avoid putting grease down your garbage disposal or any household drain. Not only could it accumulate in Village lines, it could also build up in your own system and might eventually require the services of a plumber.

Never put disposable diapers or sanitary napkins down the toilet. These were not meant to be disposed of in this manner and besides stopping up lines, could damage your plumbing system.

Is there anything I can do to reduce the possibility of sewage backups in my home?

If the lowest level of your home or office is above ground level, chances are slim that you will ever have a problem with overflows from the Village's wastewater lines. However, if the lowest level is below ground level, there is a slightly higher possibility that you may one day be affected by a backup.

Normally, if a stoppage occurs in your neighborhood's main wastewater line, only the lowest level drains and toilets will be affected. A common point is floor drains located in basement areas.

One way to prevent sewage from backing up through these sources is to install a back flow valve on the lowest drain. For floor drains, a plumber's test plug can be used to close the drain when not in use. For further information on these items, contact a plumber or your local plumbing supply dealer.

What should I do if sewage backs up into my home?

Keeping in mind that ceramic plumbing fixtures such as toilets are fragile, quickly close all drain openings with stoppers or plugs. Tub, sink, and floor drains may need additional weight to keep them sealed. A string mop can be used to help plug toilets.

If you suspect the stoppage is in your home plumbing system, don't run any water down your drains until you or a plumber have cleared the cause of the backup.

If the backup appears to be in your neighborhood's main wastewater line, call the Public Works Department immediately at 630-271-4180.

A quick check with several nearby neighbors will help you determine if the blockage is widespread or if it is limited just to your home.

Summary of GTIA Board Meeting Minutes June 8, 2010 Pending Board Approval

Les Lavin called the meeting to order at 7:40 PM in the Training Room of the Village of Lisle Police Department. Minutes of the Prior Meeting: Minutes of the May meeting were reviewed.

Board Motion: Julie LaFond moved to approve the May minutes, Don Helgeson seconded. The motion was passed by a unanimous voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Don Helgeson reviewed the May Balance Sheet, and Income and Expense Statement. It was noted that three partial payments and one payment in full were received on 2010 past due accounts.

Board Motion: Marg Hough motioned to accept the check register expenditures of \$56,765.38 for June, Michael Olson seconded. Motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

Management Report: Telephone log line items were reviewed.

Management stated that all of the sealcoat and crack fill work has been completed.

Management reported that the Village of Lisle Engineer, Gary Elmore, observed the drainage problem along the trail behind GR1038 and stated that this would not fall under storm water management. The Board suggested that Management follow up with the Village Engineer for assistance in obtaining another professional opinion as to a possible solution to the ongoing water pooling problem.

Management met with Gary Elmore to discuss the need for the Village of Lisle to move the pedestrian crossing of Trinity Drive closer to Golfview, after the Woodglen Park renovation is complete, so it would be between the stop bar and Golfview Drive.

Management submitted a planting application from GTIA residents at SR1004 for Board review. Board members will review the site and bring their comments to the July Board meeting.

Management provided a list of May 2010 newcomers. Board Directors are encouraged to call on newcomers in their respective areas.

GTIA Yearly Assessment Policy

Assessments are paid annually. The billing for the new year's assessment will be mailed out no later than Nov. 29th. Payment is due Jan. 1st. If payment is not received by Feb. 1st, an administrative fee is added to the assessment. If an owner does not receive an invoice by Dec. 10th, notify management immediately. GTIA policy states the homeowner is responsible for paying on time, with or without the invoice. At their meeting on June 16, the Lisle Park District Board of Park Commissioners awarded the contract for the Woodglenn Park Development project. The contract was awarded to Benchmark Construction, a general contractor out of Bartlett, Illinois, in an amount not to exceed \$905,897.17; \$194,000 under budget. Construction is scheduled to begin during the week of July 5th, however you may see some staging begin during the week of June 28th. Cilantro Rice (6 servings)

An ideal summer side for anything off the grill!

1-1/2 C long-grain white rice

2 C water

1-1/2 tsp Kosher salt

1 C fresh cilantro

1/2 C chopped white onion

1/4 C chopped scallions

1-1/2 T chopped fresh

jalapeno, including seeds

1-1/2 T fresh lime juice

1 tsp olive oil

Bring rice, water and 1 teaspoon salt to a boil in a 2-quart heavy saucepan, then reduce heat to low and cover pan with a tight-fitting lid. Cook 20 minutes. Remove from heat and let stand, covered, 5 minutes. Remove lid and fluff rice with a fork. While rice is cooking, puree cilantro, onion, scallion, jalapeno, lime juice, olive oil, and remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt in a blender (if necessary, may need to add 1 to 2 T water). Add mixture to rice and stir with a fork until combined well.
