Are you looking for a way to get more involved in your community? Run for a Director position with the Green Trails Improvement Association (GTIA). GTIA is your homeowners association. The GTIA board consists of 15 directors – one per area – who are tasked with the job of keeping Green Trails’ common areas beautiful. Becoming a board member offers a unique volunteer opportunity to make a visible difference in your community.

This year, 6 of the 15 Board of Directors positions are up for election. At the beginning of October, an election ballot is sent to every homeowner in the areas up for election. If you don’t know the area in which you reside, check the mailing label on the back of this newsletter. Areas are referenced by the letters A through O.

What does GTIA do?

GTIA's main responsibility is to maintain 16 of the 26 miles of paths that wind their way through the Green Trails subdivision. The other 10 miles are maintained primarily by the Lisle Park District. GTIA also maintains 198 lights along those 16 miles of trails and maintains the areas around the 5 Green Trails welcome signs. GTIA operated on an approximate budget of \$400,000 for 2011.

What do board members do?

Board members meet in the evenings on the 2nd Tuesday of each month. Meetings typically are held at Kennedy Junior High, but the location may vary and any changes in location are printed in the Pathfinder newsletter and on the home page of the website (www.greentrails.org) before the meeting. The meetings can last anywhere from 30 minutes to 2 hours. Board members also serve on committees where their talents can best be put to use. Committees may meet a few times per year.

Why are there so many openings for board members?

Typically, 5 board positions (one-third) are up for election each year. Due to a lack of candidates in previous elections, some board members have been appointed to their positions. Appointed board members live in Green Trails, but do not necessarily live in the area that they represent. These positions, therefore, are put up for election. If you live in an area whose position is not up for election and you want to be considered for an appointed position, please contact management.

If you would like to know more about what is involved in being a board member, or need more information on becoming a candidate, please call management at 630-961-7456, or contact the current board member for your area. To see the Board of Directors in action, come to one of our meetings at 7:30 p.m. on the second Tuesday of each month. Summary of GTIA Board Meeting Minutes August 9, 2011 Pending Board Approval

Peter Bakas called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM in the Tree House Room at the Grounds for Hope Café-Green Trails Center. Board members present: Peter Bakas, Lou Beccavin, Bill Burlein, Pat Coughlin-Schillo, Marisa DeAngelis, Don Helgeson, Marg Hough, Bob Klaeren, Julie LaFond, Les Lavin, Christy McGovern, Mark Munoz, Roger Sassen. Board members excused: Roxanne Nagel, Michael Olson. Management: Joanne Broda. Paula Gleason was Recording Secretary. A quorum was present.

Open Forum: None

Minutes of the Prior Meeting: Minutes of the July meeting were reviewed.

Board Motion: Marg Hough moved to approve the July minutes, Julie LaFond seconded. The motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: In Michael Olson's absence, Peter Bakas reviewed the July Balance Sheet, and Income and Expense Statement. It was noted that four partial payments and three payments in full were received on 2011 past due accounts.

Board Motion: Don Helgeson motioned to accept the revised check register expenditures of \$184,263.13 for August, Pat Coughlin-Schillo seconded. Motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

Management Report:

Telephone log line items were reviewed.

Management noted that all scheduled work on the trails has been completed except for restoration. A copy of the invoice for the cost of trail replacement on the south end of Woodglen Park has been submitted to the Lisle Park District for reimbursement of 50% of that cost, in the amount of \$10,662.94.

After restoration, the remaining work to be done is repair work. Three areas that require attention are broken asphalt along the edge of a trail and two sink holes; all will be completed this month.

Management reported that the fence along Four Lakes by HF5 has again been broken into several times. Also, the "Private Property, No Trespassing" signs that were posted, have been torn down. Management requested quotes to install incremental horizontal metal poles across any possible opening. All American Fence declined to quote due to time constraints; First Fence quoted \$1,680.

Board Motion: Bob Klaeren motioned to accept the First Fence proposal as submitted in the amount of \$1,680 to install 6 gauge wire and four poles through each section of fence behind HF016, Marisa DeAngelis seconded. Motion

GTIA Yearly Assessment Policy

Assessments are paid annually. The billing for the new year's assessment will be mailed out no later than Nov. 29th. Payment is due Jan. 1st. If payment is not received by Feb. 1st, an administrative fee is added to the assessment. If an owner does not receive an invoice by Dec. 10th, notify management immediately. GTIA policy states the homeowner is responsible for paying on time, with or without the invoice. If your address has changed, or if you have any questions regarding your bill, call Joanne Broda at JRM Properties at 630-961-7456.

SELLING? REFINANCING?

Anyone selling or refinancing within the Green Trails Improvement Association area should require a letter from JRM Properties, Inc., regarding their status of the yearly assessment charge. Requests for such may be called into the Management Office or requested by letter. Information to provide is as follows: 1) Property address; 2) Seller's attorney name and phone number; 3) Buyer's name; and 4) Date of closing. was passed by unanimous voice vote.

The First Fence proposal requires a 50% deposit of \$840, therefore the approved check register for August will be increased by that amount. Board members suggested that Management also file a police report on damages to this area and the security issues involved.

The Board meeting for September will be at Kennedy Jr. High LRC.

Management reported receipt of a check in the amount of \$500 from an owner for 50% reimbursement of the cost to remove a tree which fell from their property into the common area during a severe storm.

Management has authorized our landscape maintenance contractor to accomplish an additional mowing which will result in another increase to the approved August check register in the amount of \$4,493.18. The addition of the First Fence deposit of \$840 and the Falduto payment of \$4,493.18 will bring the revised August check register to a total of \$189,596.31

Management provided a list of July newcomers. Board Directors are encouraged to call on newcomers in their respective areas.

Finance Committee: In Michael Olson's absence, Joe Broda distributed copies of the results of the Finance & Maintenance Committee meeting of July 20th for Board member review prior to the next Board meeting. The handout included a work item list, line item changes, a 2012 proposed budget and budget details, the 2011 approved budget with 2010 actuals and a composite of GTIA budgets for the last 16 years.

Maintenance Committee: Les Lavin invited interested Board members to walk with him along College Road to assess the status of all of the trees in that area.

Communications Committee: No report

Parks Committee: Pat Coughlin-Schillo thanked Board members who had completed their assigned park evaluation forms. Les Lavin gave a synopsis of the July Lisle Park District Board meeting; Christy McGovern is scheduled to attend the August meeting.

Nominating Committee: Management submitted information of open Board member positions that was published in the Pathfinder.

Old Business/New Business: Piper Tree Service has offered to send out a crew for a day, as needed, at a cost of \$1,800, to perform routine tree maintenance and raise up tree branches of maturing trees. This additional tree maintenance cost has already been budgeted and approved.

There was discussion about the necessity of continuing to maintain the Gazebo; the consensus of the Board was that the expenses are minimal in exchange for the ambiance that the Gazebo adds to Green Trails.

Board Member Area Reports: None

Adjournment

Board Motion: There being no further business, Marg Hough motioned to adjourn the meeting, Lou Beccavin seconded. The motion was passed by unanimous voice vote; the meeting was adjourned at 8:55 p.m.

Remember to Trim Trees, Bushes, and Along Fences



Attention all homeowners! We are once again issuing an important reminder that you are responsible for the maintenance of any landscaping on your property which may extend out into the common area and trail, such as trees and bushes. Branches

extending out and/or hanging low into the trail area can be hazardous to passersby, especially at night when they cannot be clearly seen. It is most important that you remember to raise up the branches of your trees so that an individual passing on the trail, either on foot or on a bike, will have clear passage under them. Bushes should be trimmed back so that they are completely clear of the trail by at least two feet. The most common problem with bushes is seen when they are planted along a fence. Often-times, trimming is done on the inside of the yard but not on the outside of the fence.

Fences are another problem. Please remember that both side of the fence belong to you and that you need to trim grass growing close to the backside of your fence. It is difficult for our mowing crew to cut close to fences. Where they cannot cut, the weeds and grass get tall. If you decide to put up a fence, especially a privacy fence, please be responsible for the upkeep of both sides and remember to clean up your fence line whenever you mow your yard.

Your cooperation in keeping our trails neat and safe will be greatly appreciated.

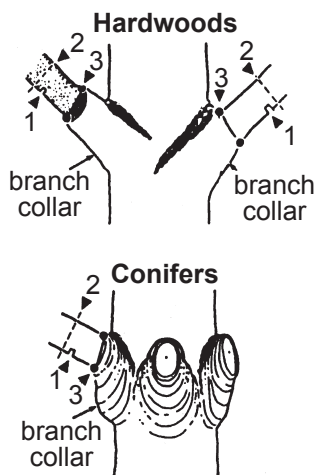
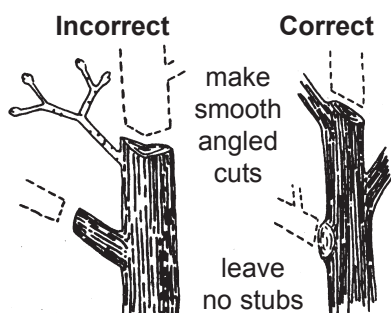

Pruning Tips

Early Spring before buds swell is a good time to prune some of your trees and bushes. Before grabbing that electric trimmer and setting out to tame your landscape, take a few minutes to review how pruning should be done. Remember, your goal is to enhance your landscaping, not mangle it. Some common pruning practices can actually be harmful, rather than helpful.

First, review the basics of how to make proper pruning cuts. A single well-placed cut works for smaller branches. For larger branches, use the 3-step method to avoid branch splitting and ripping live bark.



3-Step Branch Removal

1. Notch under-side of limb
2. Cut thru from upperside
3. Cut stub outside branch collar swelling

Next, what are you going to prune? Shrubs? Deciduous trees? Evergreen trees? There are different considerations for each.

Shrubs

There are at least 4 different techniques for pruning shrubs. Decide which technique is

right for a given shrub before starting to cut. When to prune depends on species. Early spring is best for many, but wait until after flowering for species like lilacs.

Heading back is used to shape or control growth of a shrub. Selected branches are cut back to a lateral bud or branch.

Rejuvenation is used to restore some species of old shrubs. All stems or canes are cut back to the ground.

Renewal pruning is a multi-year process of removing a portion of the oldest stems to encourage vigor or flowering.

Shearing is done on *new growth* to maintain formal shape, ex. hedges. Shearing is more common than it should be—because it's faster. Often, heading back would be a better choice.

Evergreen trees

Pruning practices vary markedly for different types of evergreens. Use the right strategy for your tree. Cutting branch ends back into woody stems will kill the entire branch on some species. Know what you're doing before cutting!

Take advantage of The Morton Arboretum Plant Clinic, either in person or online at www.mortonarb.org (click Plant Trees, Plant Clinic, Horticultural Care, Information Leaflets). Their Horticultural Care information leaflets are very helpful, with detailed instructions and diagrams.

Pruning Trees shows how and where to make proper cuts, and also when to prune trees.

Pruning Deciduous Shrubs gives details and diagrams of the four techniques for pruning shrubs, and lists which techniques and timing are appropriate for many shrub species.

Pruning Evergreens provides both general and specific advice for whorled-branched evergreens (pines, spruces) and random-branched evergreens (arbovitae, junipers).

Corn Casserole (4 Servings)

This quick corn recipe combines fresh Mirai corn, green peppers and onion obtained from the Lisle French market - sure to become a family favorite!

| 6 Tbsp butter | 4 cups fresh corn kernels (4 ears) |
| 1 small onion, chopped | 1 C crushed saltine or Club crackers |
| 1 small green bell pepper, chopped | 1 C milk |
| 3 eggs | $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt; and ground pepper, to taste |

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Heat butter in a medium skillet over medium heat until melted. Add onion and green pepper; cook, stirring often, until softened, about 5 minutes. Beat the eggs in a large bowl, add the onion and green pepper. Stir in the corn, crackers, milk, salt and pepper, mix well. Pour into a greased 13 x 9 inch baking pan; bake until golden brown on top, about 40 minutes.
